Open CINAHL from the course guide or from the A-Z list on the library's webpage (www.bradley.edu/library)
Click on 'Choose Databases'

There are several ways to save your search results.

First, you can copy a persistent link to whatever document you are saving your search information to.

Second, you can save them to the folder and export them.

Items on the page you are viewing are the only ones that can be saved. So, you have to save every page individually.

When you are done, open folder

Click on Export

There are different ways to export. The first choice works with most citation management systems. CSV can be read by EXCEL, and will produce a file that has the parts of the citation in columns, like article title, journal title, volume, etc.
