Another option that is available to you is the extended job search. An extended job search is a little bit different from connectSC because it uses the whole NACELink network, so this might be companies that are just searching for college students but they're not specifying USC students.

Within this you might put some of the key words of what it is that you're looking for. Let's use marketing as our continuous example and finding opportunities in say, the New York area. This will give you results that show marketing opportunities in the New York area, and various different types of areas. Through that you can click on that and apply for the job in those ways, or save it or share it in various different types of ways.

You'll see here over 500 jobs are posted. You saw the 222 jobs that were posted for marketing with connectSC, this gives you quite a few other ones that you can take into account as you're starting to look for opportunities in various different types of areas.

The recommended jobs we already went through. You can find that as a tab within connectSC or you could go here as well. Just going here as well you'll find the same results so there's that 100% match for that general office assistant position. Nothing is different, it's just another avenue to go there.

The last option that's available to you is the iNET internet network. You'll see here that it's an internship listing. We shared it with 11 other universities, Duke, Georgetown, Harvard, MIT, NYU, Northwestern, Rice, Stanford, UPenn, ourselves and Yale. You'll find various different types of internships in various different types of areas.

You have to create a new password for this. Your USC password's not going to work, but just creating a new password will get you in. Once you're in iNET it gives you pretty much a similar search option, so filling out your profile, downloading your resumes. There's a couple additional resources here that could be helpful for you. I do enjoy the Career Finder resource because if you're trying to find out a little bit more about what it is you might want to do then you can fill out this quick 62 line assessment or survey, and it ties you into different types of careers that you might want to consider. It's worthwhile to look into if you want to just explore careers a little bit more.

The internship postings themselves will be here, and here's where you can put in, again, a lot of the same information. It's only changed a little bit if you want to do it based on majors, but the advanced search is there, the search agents are there, everything along those lines.



Again, I might use the term marketing here, but since I'm not as specific in terms of where I want to be then I could do a search and through that you'll probably find that there's more opportunities, nationwide opportunities, stuff in Massachusetts, California, all over the place. Definitely utilize internship, or iNET to help you in expanding your options as well.

That's a quick tour of connectSC and how you can use it to help you in searching for opportunities as internships, on-campus jobs or full-time. Don't forget to fill out your profile and check it on occasion to make sure that it's up to date because the more that your profile's up to date and filled out the more that you're going to find results that match with your profile.

Also download multiple documents, make sure that they're tailored so that when you apply for the jobs online the company sees the uniqueness of your background based on the cover letter or resume that you sent. Also think about utilizing your advanced job search and search agents because that could help you in letting connectSC work for you. Don't forget about iNET and extended job search, especially if you want to extend your job search a little bit more and maybe see what else is out there, in case you're not liking all the results or in case you want to see more of the results that are out there.
